Subject(s): Health & Physical Education

Grade Level: Grades 9

Homework

- All Health classwork/homework can be found on Google Classroom.
- All health assignments are expected to be completed by due dates. If a student does not turn in an assignment on the due date, the teacher will enter a "MI" for missing in the grade book.
- Homework obviously copied will result in a grade of "0" for the persons involved.
- Students who exhibit a chronic pattern of behavior around missing work will receive a referral for support services; individuals with extenuating circumstances will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

Late Work

- All health work must be turned in before the next health unit starts. No work will be accepted after the next Health unit has begun.
- Students will be given the opportunity to make up any missed Health work for all excused and verified absences. Immediately upon returning to school, the student must contact teachers concerning arrangements for making up work.
- For extenuating circumstances, the due date for work will be adjusted at the discretion of the teacher.
- Work turned in after the allotted number of school days may receive a reduction in grade.
- An assignment given to a student for make-up purposes will be given full credit provided it satisfies the conditions for make-up work.
- While late homework assignments will be accepted, full credit may not be awarded.

Explanation of Zeroes

- Teachers will refrain from initially giving a "0" (use "MI" - missing, "X" - exempt, or "Z", not calculated in the overall grade).
- Work submitted after the deadline is considered late work
- Incomplete assignments (after 3 days) will result in the following:
 1. Contact parents regarding missing assignments
 2. Assignment of Academic Appointment (support)

3. Completion during dedicated time in class
4. Assignments not completed and entered as a “0” - students have the opportunity to make-up the assignment(s) after documented contact has been made with the parent and the student has attended an academic appointment
5. Assignments not completed become a “0,” which is calculated into the final grade

Reassessment

- Any failing grade on a summative assignment, a student must be given the opportunity for additional instruction and reassessment.
- Teacher(s) can outline provisions a student must complete to be eligible for reassessment (participation, completion of assignments, etc.), to include:
 1. Personalized study strategies for re-takes
 2. Students must also provide evidence of test corrections and strategies used in preparing for the reassessment

Make-up Work

- Excused and verified absences, doctor’s notes, injuries, parent notes, and non-dress days must be made up before the end of the 9 weeks.
- Students are not exempt from the physical education portion of the class – the student is required to have their doctor complete the Ocean Lakes High School P.E. Injury/Illness Form – the doctor must check all activities that student can participate in.
- The long-term injury form can be found on the Ocean Lakes web-site under Parents/Others.
- Days must be made up by attending another Physical Education class during the students’ “It’s Academic” block (s).
- Participating in the following programs will count as a make-up P.E. day: Ocean Lakes High School conditioning programs, Ocean Lakes High School in-season sports teams, and the Marching-band, dance, STEP, Color-guard.
- No written work will be given as P.E. make-up work.
- Individuals with extenuating circumstances will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

Extra Credit

- Used sparingly and purposefully; must be related to the assignment
