Dear Parent/Guardian:

Your student has signed up for summer school through Stanwood-Camano School District. Here is important information you need to be aware of:

**Location:** Stanwood High School (room assignments to be determined)

**Dates:** August 1 – August 26 (Monday-Friday)

**Time:** 9 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (arrive by 8:45 for breakfast)

**Course Work:** Approximately 20-30 additional hours outside of class time

**Program:** Edgenuity (online program)

**Food Service:** Breakfast and lunch will be served onsite at no cost

**Parking:** Student parking and drop off is at the main front entrance (272nd Street). Students will enter through the building on the 2nd floor, where the main office is located.

**Transportation:** Life 360 Church: pick up 7:55 drop off 12:10  
300th St Park n Ride: pick up 8:25 drop off 12:30  
Elger Bay Elementary: pick up 8:04 drop off 12:28  
Utsalady Elementary: pick up 8:20 drop off 12:14

***A parent or guardian must be present at drop off. If no parent or guardian is present, students will be transported back to school.***

*Reminders about the program:*

- Students are expected to be in attendance all twenty days or until they have finished course work.
- Students might need to work on course work at home, depending on how they spend their time during the three hours at school each day.
- Students are to adhere to school and district policy regarding behavior on campus.
- Students may be dropped from the program after **three days** of unexcused absences.
- Parents/guardians need to make sure students attend summer school each day.
- Parents/guardians can encourage/provide support for student(s) to complete their course work.
- Students must finish the course by the end of the session, as they will not have an opportunity to finish after the summer school session is over.
