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STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

Stanwood-Camano School District will provide a summer school program for high school students who are credit deficient. The program is designed to help students get back on track for graduating from high school in four years. Please read the description of the program, along with the student and parent/guardian expectations, and sign this form that you agree to the expectations.

Summer School Description:

- The summer school program will run for 20 days, August 3rd – August 28th, 2020 and be 3 hours each day.
- The **class fee is \$50**. Payment and enrollment form need to be turned in to the **Stanwood High School Office** no later than **Friday, June 12th, 2020**.
Parents/guardians of students who qualify for the National Free and Reduced-Price meal program (NFRP) and have a current application on file with the district office are eligible for a free or reduced summer school participation fee. A copy of the Notice of Eligibility for Free or Reduced-Price Meals or a print out from Family Access must be provided by the guardian and attached to this form, in order to take advantage of either the free or reduce-price fee. (Applications for the NFRP are available on-line, at all schools, and the district office). Parents/guardians are responsible for completing and submitting the required paperwork.
- Students will use an online program to complete courses they are deficient in.
- Students will have access to a Math/Science teacher and an English/History teacher for support (four days a week). *Due to Washington state reopening phasing restrictions, teacher support may be provided virtually in an open, online setting.
- One day a week there will be a para educator to support students.

Student Expectations:

- Students are expected to be in attendance all twenty days or until they have finished course work.
- Students might need to work on course work at home, depending on how they spend their time during the three hours at school each day.
- Students are to adhere to school and district policy regarding behavior on campus.

Parent/Guardian Expectations:

- Parents/guardians need to make sure students attend summer school each day.
- Parents/guardians can encourage/provide support for student to complete course work.
