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THE ADMINISTRATION: GOALS AND ORGANIZATION

The goal of the Town of Webb Union Free School District is to deliver a challenging and diverse education to its students. Reasoning and the ability to think critically, as well as mastery of academic skills, are necessary to prepare our students to be productive workers and citizens. Creativity and innovation must continue to be fostered within the educational environment to enable our students to reach their full potential.

By law, the Board of Education sets District policy. The Education Law grants to the Superintendent the general authority to carry it out. The District's organizational structure has been created to transmit the legal authority of the Board of Education through the Superintendent to those with specific responsibilities.

Organizational flexibility allows communication and decision making to arise from District needs rather than a fixed hierarchy. It is the intent of the Board, therefore, that the District's organizational structure shall remain flexible enough to change with the needs of the District.

The Board of Education has adopted the following general principles for administration:

1. The Board shall set District policy but shall delegate to its administrators the authority to carry it out.
2. The welfare of the District as a whole will be the paramount concern of administrators at all levels, with no function receiving disproportionate emphasis.
3. Developments in educational theory shall continuously be examined in light of the District's commitment to educational excellence.
4. Continuing education, from short workshops through graduate courses, shall be encouraged for staff members at every level.
5. The Board encourages the broadest possible participation in the decision making process of the District by teachers, staff members, students, parents, and members of the community.
