

FOOD SERVICE FINANCE POLICY1. **PARTICIPATION**

The Board has authorized the participation of the District in the National School Lunch Program. The Cook-Manager is designated as the Program Officer. A reimbursable breakfast and lunch is available to each student.

2. **FINANCE**

Financial reimbursement and food subsidies are received from the federal government, thus offering students lunches at a minimum cost. Adults using the breakfast and/or lunch service pay a higher amount, since there is no aid for their meals.

Free or reduced price breakfast and/or lunches are available to students who qualify under federal regulations. The District will use the New York State Family Income Scale for determining eligibility.

3. **SUPERVISION**

The Cook-Manager is responsible for the overall supervision of the Program, and reports directly to the Superintendent. The Manager develops the breakfast and lunch menus, which are printed monthly, but are subject to change without notice. Menus are based on the national nutrition requirements.

The School Breakfast/Lunch Program shall have a separate account from the general fund of the School District. The budgetary objective of the Program is to operate without subsidy by the general fund of the School District. Therefore, the Board, upon recommendation of the administration, shall set the breakfast and lunch prices necessary, in an effort to cover the unreimbursed costs.
