TITLE I SCHOOLWIDE PROGRAM

Where we came from . . .

Title I is the largest program of federal funding in education, signed into law in 1965 by President Lyndon Johnson. President Johnson recognized the extremely difficult problem that children throughout the country were having with their reading and mathematics. In an effort to help them catch up, extra attention, materials and teachers were provided by the Elementary Secondary Education Act, Title I (ESEA).

In December 2015, President Obama signed the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). ESSA reauthorized the Elementary and Secondary Act "to ensure that every child achieves." Under this act, the purpose of Title I is to provide all children significant opportunity to receive fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps."

Where we are . . .

The purpose of Title I is to assist schools in improving student achievement, staff development and family engagement. Schools utilize Title I funds to enhance the regular district instructional program. All Citrus County public elementary and middle schools use Title I funds to support school-wide Programs. Schools use funds to:

- Add highly qualified staff
- Support parent and community involvement efforts
- Improve staff development
- Purchase additional instructional materials and supplies
- Add technology and needed equipment
