COVID-19 Guidance for Staff and Students (Updated January 27, 2021)

This information is subject to change as guidelines are updated from NJDOH/CDC

Scenarios	Actions
<p>Low-risk symptoms: sore throat, headache, nausea, *vomiting, *diarrhea, fatigue, runny nose, muscle ache, chills (no fever) (Two of these symptoms)</p> <p>No exposure, history of close contact, potential exposure, recent travel</p> <p>*Vomiting and/or diarrhea – will be sent home (similar to pre-Covid-19), unless in the nurse’s judgement, these symptoms are due to migraine, menstrual cycle or food allergy.</p>	<p>Students and staff must stay home or be sent home if they have TWO of these Covid-19 compatible symptoms.</p> <p>May not return to school until they have either received:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• A negative covid test (viral or antigen) presented and pre-approved by the school nurse (HR for staff member), OR• Completed an isolation period of at least 10 days since symptom onset and at least 24 hours after resolution of a fever without fever-reducing medications. <p>A purely clinical alternative diagnosis (doctor’s note) will NOT be accepted without fulfilling either of the above NJDOH mandates.</p>
<p>High-risk symptom (s): fever above 100 degrees, cough, SOB, difficulty breathing, new olfactory disorder, new taste disorder (One symptom)</p>	<p>Students and staff must stay home or isolate in the nurse’s office and be sent home with ONE of these symptoms..</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• May not return to class.• Belongings should be sent to nurse’s office.• May not return to school until they have either received a negative COVID-19 test (viral or antigen) presented and pre-approved by the school nurse (HR for staff member) OR have completed an isolation period of at least 10 days since symptom onset and at least 24 hours after resolution

	<p>of a fever without fever-reducing medications.</p> <p>A purely clinical alternative diagnosis (doctor's note) will NOT be accepted without fulfilling either of the above NJDOH mandates.</p>
All Covid-19 positive students and staff	<p>Must stay home for a minimum of 10 calendar days, have been asymptomatic without analgesics for a minimum of 24 hours and have a clearance letter from healthcare provider submitted and pre-approved by the school nurse (HR for staff members)</p>
Out-of-state and out-of-country travel is discouraged.	<p>Any student or staff member who travels out-of-country or out-of-state outside the immediate region (NY, CT, PA, DE) is required to quarantine for 10 days. Compliance is expected. Please notify building principal (staff members also notify HR).</p>
<p>Close contact (as defined by CDC) of staff or student with COVID-19 or to someone who has COVID-19 compatible symptoms (two low- or one high-risk symptom)</p> <p>* Close contact is defined by CDC as someone who was within six feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period starting from two days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, two days prior to test specimen collection) until the time the individual is isolated.</p>	<p>Close contacts of a COVID-19 case (or compatible symptoms) are quarantined for 14 days from the date of last contact. Close contacts of an individual with COVID-19 compatible symptoms are excluded for 14 days from date of last contact, or until the individual with symptoms tests negative for COVID-19.</p>

Students or staff who return without the aforementioned clearance documentation will be isolated and sent home.

All students who are home ill may switch to remote learning if well enough to participate. Please contact your child's teacher as well as the absentee hotline, principal and school nurse.
